Death of Mr. G. J. Henebry

The death has taken place at Walton-on-Thames of Mr Geoffrey Henebry, aged 65, manager of the Foreign Exchange branch in London of the National Bank. He was a native of Windgap, Kilkenny. Deceased joined the Brazilian Bank in 1910, but returned to England to join the Navy in 1914. After the war he joined the National Bank. Mr Henebry was well known in Limerick as a prominent member of the Garryowen Football Club, figuring in many memorable Munster Cup games. While playing with Garryowen he was chosen as full-back for the Irish team, and played for Ireland on six occasions between 1906 and 1909. He also played for Rockwell College and Lansdowne. He is survived by his wife and two sons, to whom the sympathy of all old friends in Limerick goes out in an unstinted manner.
