Found On The Roadside

Rathkeale Farmer's Death

Found lying in an unconscious condition on the roadside at Amogan, Rathkeale, Michael Enright (49), farmer and widower, of Ballylio, Croagh, died shortly after seceiving spiritual aid from Rev T Murphy. P P, Croagh.

He was dead before medical assistance arrived on the scens.

Deceased, it is believed, left Rathkeale

Dr W J Mulcahy, Mo. Rathkeale, subsequently performed a post-mortem and certified that death was due to cerebral haemorrhage. Deceased, it was stated, had not been in good health for some time, and complained of severe headaches.
