DIED IN CHURCH

While attending an early Mass at
the Franciscan Church yesterday,

expired within a few minutes. The
body was subsequently removed to
Barrington's Hospital. Deceased
was a native of Kilrush, but had
resided in Limerick for a number of
years, and deepest sympathy will be
tendered to his wife and two
children on their tragic bereave-
ment. Death was due to natural
causes and an inquest was not
deemed necessary. The deceased,
who was a member of the Third
Order of St. Francis, had been at-
tending the Retreat for that body
during the week, and was present
yesterday morning for the Gene-
ral Communion. A deservedly
very popular figure, the news of
his death will be heard of with
regret all over Munster, where he
was very well and favourably
known.
