In my opinion these retorts should not be worked again until I have an opportunity of examining them to see if it is possible to repair them, although, as already reported to you, it is very doubtful if anything can be done with them.

Arising from my report, I feel that Banks's action in putting No. 4 retort to work, having long since been informed by me that it was defective, and without consulting me, and also in not emptying the retorts when I told him to do so, creates an impossible position at the Gas Works which may have serious consequences to the undertaking. I should, therefore, be obliged for your instructions as to how I should proceed in dealing with this matter. In coming to a decision, it would be well to bear in mind that we were extremely lucky that no serious damage was done to the Retort Installation, and that the longer the retorts in question are now kept working the longer will the risk of damage be unnecessarily prolonged.

### POSTSCRIPT.

Postscript to letter:— Upon my return from lunch to-day, and after this report was written, I noticed more timber being hoisted to the retort bunker. I questioned Banks about this, and he informed me that you had instructed him to hoist it and keep No. 4 Retort working. He also stated that he was not prepared to take his orders from me and that he had received confirmation, in writing, from you that he was to accept orders from you only and that you had put him in charge of production. This, despite the fact that you had not visited the Works by that time to-day, which clearly indicates that he had sufficient confidence in your attitude to get in touch with you on the matter, and that he had no regard for my instructions or authority. In view of this I must request that you let me have a definite clarification of my position in writing at your earliest convenience.
