## DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE REGULATIONS

Potatoes will not be allowed to be exported by the Department of Agriculture unless they are of good table size, sound and free from blight or soft rot. They should be reasonably free from soil and they must not be injured or cut. The containers (sacks) in which they are packed must be filled to capacity in all cases.

## METHOD OF FORWARDING

In order to benefit from a special transport arrangement with the Railway Companies the potatoes should be consigned as from the Irish Red Cross local Branch and be addressed to:
