The Earl of Dunraven was paid a very deserved tribute at the annual meeting of the Limerick Horse Show Society on Saturday, when he was re-elected president for the sixteenth year in a row. HEALTH OF CITY.

The public health conditions in the city, despite the vigorous winter we have experienced, is exceptionally good. During last month two cases of typhoid were notified, but these, having regard to their history, need not cause any anxiety. Scabies—a form of rash attributed to emergency conditions—is still somewhat prevalent. In February there were fifty-one notifications as compared with forty-six for January. Again, this disease need not upset our equilibrium, as scabies—though very infectious—can be speedily eradicated if taken in time.
