SCARIFF FAIR

Early and quick sales on all kinds of stock were effected at the Scariff April fair on the 3rd inst. There was an air of happiness and contentment on all fair-goers. The general advance since the previous fair exceeded the most sanguine expectations, and the depression of a few years ago was quite forgotten in the joy of the enhanced value of the cattle of to-day. Quotations:—Cattle—One year old, £8 to £10; 1½ year old, £12 to £16; 2 and 3 year old, £15 to £20; 3 and 4 year old, £20 to £30; young calves, £3 to £4; dairy cows, £20 to £25; springers, £25 to £30. Sheep—Hoggets, £4 to £5; fat, £6 to £7.

KILMALLOCK FAIR.

Kilmallock April fair was large and prices were well maintained. Details:—Yearlings, first class, heifers, £14 to £16; second quality, £10 to £14; others, £6 to £9; 1½ year old heifers, £12 to £16; seconds, £8 to £11; bullocks, £15 to £17 10s.; seconds, £9 to £13; 2 year old heifers, £18 to £25; seconds, £15 to £17 10s.; 2 year old bullocks, £17 to £25; m-calf heifers, first class, £28 to £35; seconds, £20 to £27 10s.; dry cows, first class, £20 to £26; seconds, £14 to £19; old cows, £5 to £12; store pigs, £4 to £6 10s.

CHARLEVILLE MARKETS

Dropped calves sold for veal at the Charleville weekly calf market, which opened last week, were sold at prices ranging from 5/- to 12/- each. Calves purchased in the country districts made 15/- each.

About 20 bacon pigs were taken at the fortnightly pig market. Price, 122/- per cwt. (1w.). Store pigs were much dearer than previous quotations and were sold at from £5 to £6 each.
