Widespread regret has been occasioned by the death of Mr. William McAuliffe, of Meenoline, Templeglantine, which occurred on 2nd inst., after an illness of brief duration. Aged about 70 years, deceased belonged to a very old and esteemed West Limerick farming family. He was brother of Mr. Denis McAuliffe, M.C.C., Newcastle West, and of Mr. Cors. McAuliffe, Ahawilk, Feohenagh. The late Mr. McAuliffe, who leaves a large family to mourn his passing, was pre-deceased by his wife only fifteen months ago. Sincere sympathy will be extended to the bereaved family and relatives. The funeral, which took place on 3rd inst., from Templeglantine Parish Church to the parish cemetery, was the largest and most representative seen in the district for many years and was in itself a striking manifestation of the regard in which deceased and his family are held.
