Factors are involved in the raising of pigs, many of them are common to some of them not. The advantages of breeding pigs nearly all are effective, but the advantages do not, as a rule, last long. When young pigs are raised a few weeks after weaning, the advantages of exercise and fresh air and sunlight

KNITTING IDEAS.

Celluloid needles which have become bent may be straightened by holding in the steam from a boiling kettle until pliable. Straighten with the fingers, then plunge at once into cold water to set.
