KNITTING IDEAS.

Here are a few hints which will help knitters.

Should light coloured wool become soiled, despite all precautions, sprinkle a little flour or bicarbonate of soda over the piece of work, roll in a clean white towel, leave for a couple of days, then shake out powder and the unclean marks will go.

Celluloid needles which have become bent may be straightened by holding in the steam from a boiling kettle until pliable. Straighten with the fingers, then plunge at once into cold water to set.
