FOUNDATION STONE LAID

The Most Rev. Dr. Michael Fogarty, Bishop of Killaloe, on the anniversary of his diamond jubilee in the priesthood, yesterday blessed and laid the foundation stone of a new oratory at St. Flannan's College, Ennis.

The oratory is estimated to cost over £25,000, and will accommodate over 300 students when completed.

Students of the college presented the Bishop with an address of felicitation on his jubilee, and Dr. Fogarty, in reply, congratulated the boys on their singing and responses, and, as a gesture of appreciation, granted them two free days.
