WEEKLY DAIRY MARKET.

Tuesday, September 18th—The entry at to-day's market totalled a full seasonable supply; the larger proportion being heifers. The class on sale was of a good average description, including some promising dairy cows and heifers, and a few outstanding lots. Strong attendance of buyers wanting the best. Trade for promising lots was steady, and in the case of cows or heifers showing milking qualities prices were firm around last Tuesday's rates. Dairy proprietors wanting cows and heifers with quality and substance, and for this class there is brisk demand and sharp competition; full current rates. More choice cows and heifers could have been sold. Promising in-calf heifers had purchasers, and there were sufficient buyers to absorb all lots which gave an indication of being a profitable investment. Small and poor heifers met an easier trade at weaker rates. All round full current rates, and in the case of choice cows and heifers prices favoured vendors; no difficulty in exchange for this class. Full seasonable turnover. Market practically sold up. Mr. Thomas Behan, Ballybrown, Clarina, topped the market with a choice dairy cow which attracted
