**THE MUNSTER FAIR**

The Munster Fair at Limerick to-day was well stocked in all departments. Trade, generally speaking, was good, though the demand for two year olds and yearlings was not very pronounced and transactions were a bit dragged. Forward stores, however, exchanged hands freely at prices showing an upward tendency. Springers, too, were sought after and promising milchers were disposed of at enhanced values. Beef, in fairly good supply, was bought up at somewhat higher rates. Average quotations—3 year olds, in forward condition, £33 to £35 (one exceptionally fine lot of pollies realised £36 10s. per head); 2 year olds, £18 15s. to £20; 1 year olds, £14 15s. to £16 10s.; springers, £32 10s. to £35; prime beef, 62/- per cwt. on foot; old cows sold at fixed factory quotations. A general clearance effected in all departments.

Complete clearance in this section. In store department some useful drafts of feeders were shown; well bred forward bullocks with condition found ready purchasers; previous rates well maintained. In the younger section active demand and ready sale for choice bullocks and heifers, around last week's basis of prices, but slightly better trade for bullocks than heifers; commercial cattle enquired for and sold well at
