FOUND SHOT

Young Woman's Sad End

TRAGIC SHOOTING AFFAIR

A tragic occurrence, involving the death of a young married woman—Mrs. Philomena Hennerty—took place at Killee, near Patrickswell, County Limerick, at about 7 o'clock yesterday evening.

The deceased, accompanied by her husband, Mr. J. J. Hennerty, Horticultural Instructor under the County Limerick Committee of Agriculture and their two young children, drove from their home, "Hazeldene," Roxboro' Road, Limerick, to a farm at Killee, Patrickswell, where Mr. Hennerty is conducting an experimental garden.

While Mr. Hennerty was engaged in the garden, and during the absence of the farmer—Mr. Conway—who had left to milk the cows—a shot was heard. Later the dead body of Mrs. Hennerty was found at the rere of the house, death being caused by a gunshot wound. Adjacent to the body lay a shot gun belonging to Mr. Conway.

Very deep sympathy is felt for Mr. Hennerty in his great affliction.

An inquest was opened this evening by Mr. M. E. Cussen, solicitor, Coroner for East Limerick.
