LIMERICK SHOW

Horticultural Section Broadcast

Our readers will be interested in the subjoined description of the Horticultural Section at the Limerick Horse Show. It was broadcast recently by Mr. G. O. Sheridan in his well-known series "The Week-End in the Garden." We are allowed to publish it by kind permission of Radio Eireann. It is as follows:

I went to Limerick to judge at the great Limerick Show on the 30th August. This is one of the finest shows in Ireland, and is admirably organised by the Secretary, Mr. J. T. Barry. The horticultural section is a very large one owing to the fact that there are a number of large gardens in the neighbourhood, as well as a good orchard district at Pallaskeery and another at Newmarket-on-Fergus. There is a very strong committee running this section, headed by Lady Adaire, assisted by Mr. Wallace, who has done much to work this section up to its present high degree of excellence. Perhaps the most outstanding part of the horticultural section is that devoted to flowers arranged in bowls and vases, which in no less than 20 classes are devoted.

In addition to the usual classes for bowls and vases of particular flowers, posies and hanging baskets, there are tables to be decorated, as well as a class for the most effective classes for a flower picture arranged in a frame 5 1/2 feet wide and 2 feet deep. This is really an open box hanging on the wall, and the competitor is given a free hand as to its treatment so long as the flowers supplied are the principal feature. Mrs. Wrenner, from Dublin, and my wife, were judging these classes, and told me how impressed they were with their artistic merit. The flower picture which got the first prize, particularly excited the interest of the judges. In a plain oblong glass jar quite transparent but showing a greenish tinge, was placed some sprays of hydrangeas with blue flowers turning to green as they faded. The back-ground consisted of various white, pink, and blue flowers and green foliage, and the effect of clouds at the side of the picture hung some pieces of fish netting, and at the bottom around the base of the glass jar were three of those glass balls which fishermen use for catching their nets. The effect was a green one, and of transparent glass. The whole very cleverly evoked a seaside scene, it was the work of Lady Adaire. The second prize went to a basket of zinnias, dahlias, gladioli, helianthus, and various shades of blue and white rhinthus.
