We deeply regret to announce the death of Mr. Michael J. McDonnell, L.D.S., which took place on Thursday, 27th ult, at his residence, Glentworth Street, Limerick, after a brief illness. A member of an old Limerick family, the late Mr. McDonnell was some thirty years ago an Alderman of the City Council and though he rarely took part in debate his counsel was always sought when important issues had to be decided.
