It will thus be seen that this is not merely a matter facilities for joy-riding, some short-sighted people may think. It is something that in one way or another touches almost every economic interest in the country. Our public bodies and representatives would do well, therefore, to make their wishes on this question known in a definite way so that those in authority would speedily realise that the demand for allowing these vehicles to run again is both widespread and insistent.
