WEST LIMERICK INQUEST ADJOURNED

At the request of the State, Mr. Michael E. Cussen, solicitor, Coroner for West Limerick, adjourned sine die an inquest held at the Downes, Ballingarry, on 6th inst., touching the death of Mary McCarthy, a three months old child boarded out with Mrs. Mary Murphy, of The Downs, Ballingarry, Dr. Michael O'Donnell, Acting

Dispensary Doctor for Castletown district, stated that he examined the child on 28th September last and ordered her to be removed to the County Hospital, Croom. At the request of the Coroner he performed a post-mortem examination on the body of the infant, who, despite his instructions, had not been removed to hospital. Death, in his opinion, was due to inattention and manutrition.

evidence that when the ambulance arrived for the child she had improved, and she accordingly decided not to send her to hospital. The child got ill again on the 3rd October and died on the 5th October. She stated that her reason for not sending for the doctor when the child got ill again was that he was too far away and had no way of going for him.

The inquest, as stated, was adjourned sine die at the request of the State.
