## DEATH OF WEST CLARE EX-N.T.

The death has taken place of Mrs. Mary O'Sullivan, ex-N.T., widow of Patrick O'Sullivan, ex-N.T., Doonbeg. Mrs. O'Sullivan, who was principal of the Doonbeg Girls School, gained many distinctions in her teaching career, including the Blake and Carlisle premium.
