

OBITUARY

MR. JOHN P. O'NEILL.

It is with deep and sincere regret that we chronicle the passing of Mr. John P. O'Neill, at his residence, 3, Greenan Villas, St. Joseph Street, Limerick, which sad event occurred on the 14th inst. A highly esteemed citizen, his health became impaired some months ago, and despite all the unremitting care and attention, his end came peacefully, fully resigned to the holy will of the Almighty, and fortified by the rites of the Holy Church.

Of a quiet, retiring disposition, he was held in the highest regard by his fellow-workers at the Limerick Steamship Co., Ltd., to which he was attached to the clerical staff for the last 31 years. A lifelong member of the Arch-Confraternity of the Holy Family, he showed devout attachment to his religious duties. He was father of Rev. Christopher O'Neill, a distinguished member of the Holy Ghost Order, who is now helping to spread the light of faith in far off Nigeria.

The removal of remains, which took place on Monday evening, to St. Michael's Church, was very largely and representatively attended, and testified to the respect in which the deceased was held. Solemn Requiem Mass on Tuesday was followed later in the day by the funeral to Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery. An attendance of large dimensions, which included several clergy, was a last fitting tribute to the deceased's popularity.
