# WOMAN GETS JAIL

## FOR STEALING TURKEYS

Mrs. Margaret Long, of Lisduff, Newmarket-on-Fergus, was sentenced by District Justice Gleeson at Ennis Court on Friday, to 21 days imprisonment with hard labour for stealing four turkeys.

Evidence was given that she had been convicted before on two occasions for petty larcenies. She and her husband had no house, and went round from cottage to cottage.

Supt. J. S. Flynn said the couple went into a cottage when they liked to do so and stayed with the occupants. On one occasion they imposed on the cottage tenants for a time because the tenants had not the vigour or determination to put them out, and eventually they had to be evicted from the house. They were responsible for a number of petty thefts, and he did not know whether the husband had any control over the woman or not. Probably he had not. They were not in need or anything like that, because the husband was working.

The Justice said he had given the woman two chances already and she had not profited by them.
