Dairy cows and in-calf heifers. The number on offer showed an increase as compared with last week; more cows than heifers. Big number of buyers again operating. The best enquiry being for the good promising dairy cow, preferably calved; trade not as free for the secondary cows as at last market. A substantial portion of the entry was cleared. More good cows and heifers could have been sold. Top price for calved cows went to Mr. Patrick Enright, Cratloe, Co. Clare, at £40, the runner-up being Mrs. Moloney, Doonasss, at £37 5s. In-calf and calved cows, best, £33 to £37 5s. Calves, £15 to £17.
