Monday, October 30th—Entry for to-day's market was the heaviest for the autumn season, comprising 100 cows and heifers, and included a good number of very choice and promising dairy cows and heifers. There was a strong attendance from a distance. No dearth of buyers. All in quest of cows and heifers showing dairy qualities. This description found ready and willing purchasers with a quick sale, and spirited competition. Business was marked by a strong and active demand for heifers and cows showing promise of proving good producers, and anything with such qualifications was readily bought up, top prices accordingly being paid. There was brisk enquiry for choice cows and heifers, customers being specially for this class. Spirited and unabated demand throughout the day. Rough trade for poor cows and heifers quite trade. Proving and well bred medium sized heifers in demand. A particularly choice in-calf cow realised £46 (being a record price for the season so far). Trade continued active till the close of day. The higher values of recent weeks being easily obtainable. The sale was the best this season; winding up strong, and a practical clearance. Top price for a cow went to Mrs. Collins, Newtown, at £47 10s., the runner-up being Mr. O'Connell, Clonmacken, Limerick, at £45. Top price for heifers went to Mr. C. McNamara, Woodfield, Broadford, Co. Clare, at £40. Best cows, best, £42 to £47 10s.; promising, £37 10s.; ordinary, £23 10s. to £28.
