## DEAD UNDER CART

### WEST LIMERICK TRAGEDY

Mr. R. J. Cussen, solicitor, Deputy Coroner for West Limerick, opened and adjourned an inquest at Newcastle West Courthouse on Friday of last week on Daniel O'Donnell (65), unmarried farmer, Ahawilk, who was found under his upturned horse and car at Ahawilk on the previous night.

Dr. M. O'Donnell, Dromcollogher, who carried out a post mortem, described the injuries and said death was instantaneous. Death in his opinion was due to shock and haemorrhage.

On the application of Supt. McKenna, the inquest was adjourned pending further inquiries.

The Coroner, Mr. J. Condon, foreman of the jury, and Supt. McKenna tendered sympathy to the relatives.
