Body Found In The Shannon

A Limerick Mystery

Enquiries made by the Garda aunhorities have so far failed to establish the identity of a man, aged about 60, who was taken from the Shannon at Russell's Pier about 10 o'clock on Thursday afternoon.

A verdict that death was due to cardiac failure following myocardial degeneration was returned at the inquest on deceased held at Barrington's Hospital by Mr Jas McNeice, solr, acting coroner.

Or Francis Crowe gave evidence of performing a post-mostem examination on the deceased, who was dead on admission to the hospital. In his opinion death occurred before deceased, got into the water.
