no blame attached to Mr Carmody.

Mr E Monahan, solr, who appeared for the next of kin, said there was no suggestion that Mr Carmody had been guilty of any criminal act; but this was the second accident in the same family, and it was deplosable in this state of our civilisation that children could not get the immunity they were entitled to on the Clare roads. Nobody regretted the accident more than Mr Carmody, who was the father of a

young family himself.
