

Fatal Railway Accident

Limerickman Killed at Thurles

A verdict that death was due to deceased accidentally falling or slipping in front of wagons being shunted and whilst he was in the discharge of his duties was the verdict at the inquest in Thurles on Saturday into the death of Daniel McCarthy, clerk at Thurles Railway Station, who died at the local hospital following injuries received at Thurles good store.

Dr Wm Heslily, Thurles District Hospital, stated that deceased had fracture of the spine and was unconscious when he was admitted to hospital.

The driver, shunter and fireman were commended for their prompt action in trying to avoid the accident.

Deceased, who was aged 40, was married and a native of Thomastown, County Limerick.
