## Limerick Child's Fatal Accident

A child believed by her mother to have put her mouth to the spout of a steaming kettle died in Barrington's Hospital, Limerick, on Saturday night. She was Kathleen Ryan, aged 22 years.

At an inquest held by Mr J S McNeice, solicitor, Acting Coroner, yesterday after noon, Mrs Mary Ryan, mother of the child, stated shat she was in the kitchen and had removed a boiling kettle from the gas ring to the range. She turned her back and then heard the child screaming and pointing to her mouth. She assumed that the little girl had put her mouth to the spout of the kettle, as no water was spilled.

Dr F Crowe, Barrington's Hospital, said death was fine to asphyxia following oedema of the windpipe

A verdict in accordance with the medical

testimony was returned.
