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DEATH OF MR. JAMES M. CREGAN

The death of Mr. James M. Cregan, Shelbourne Avenue, Limerick, at the early age of 19 years, is deeply regretted and heartfelt sympathy is extended to the family in their bereavement.

The deceased, who had only recently begun a journalistic career under his father, Mr. C. C. Cregan, Editor, *Limerick Leader*, had already given promise of distinguishing himself in the profession of his adoption. Of a very retiring disposition, he was held in affectionate regard in his own immediate circle and, indeed, "Jimmy" — to his intimates — was looked upon as a model young man. His kindness, gentleness, affability; his love of truth, his attachment to principles and his deep respect and reverence for authority were his striking characteristics. He was a very loveable young man and all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance deeply deplore his death, which took place in Barrington's Hospital in the early hours of Thursday morning following a comparatively brief illness.

The remains were removed to St. Munchin's Church last evening amidst many manifestations of regret and sorrow. In the cortege were many youths who had been associated with the deceased in Gaelic games, of which he was an exponent since his childhood.

The funeral took place this afternoon to Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery, mourners having come from far and near to take part in the obsequies.
