### ACCUSED REMANDED AGAIN

Charged with the wilful murder  
of Norman Graham (20), 3 Castle  
Street, Limerick, John Gleeson (18),  
of New Road, Thomondgate, again  
appeared in custody before Mr. J. M.  
Flood, B.L., D.J., at the monthly  
sitting of Limerick Liberties Court  
this morning.

Gleeson is charged in connection  
with the fatal stabbing of Graham,  
who was found, bleeding from a  
wound in the abdomen, in a lane-  
way off Catherine Street on the  
night of December 14th last. A few  
hours later he died in Barrington's  
Hospital.

Supt. P. Colleran prosecuted, and  
Mr. D. G. O'Donovan, solr., appeared  
for accused.

The Superintendent made a formal  
deposition asking for a remand of  
accused in custody until Monday  
of next week.

Mr. O'Donovan said he had no  
objection to such an adjournment.
