SENATOR BEREAVED

An Taoiseach (Mr. de Valera) was represented by Senator J. T. Keane at the funeral of Mr. Brendan McInerney, Cahersherkin, Co. Clare, son-in-law of Senator T. V. Honan, Ennis, Chairman of Ennis Urban Council. Deceased was only 36 years of age and met his death as a result of a tragic accident at Skark, New Ross, Co. Wexford, where he was employed as Principal of Ennis-corthy Vocational School. He was educated at St. Mary's College, Galway, and St. Flannan's College, Ennis, and having taken his degree of B. Agr. Science at the National University, was for a time technical adviser at the beet factory in Mallow. An Taoiseach sent a special message of sympathy to Senator T. V. Honan on the untimely death. The remains were escorted from Skark by a guard of honour of the local L.D.F. and were met half way by the New Ross L.D.F., the members of which accompanied them to the train. On arrival at Ennistymon they were met by the L.D.F. also, which supplied a firing party at the funeral to Ennistymon Churchyard.
