## THE U-BOAT CAMPAIGN

Col. Philmore, a member of the prosecuting team, began at Nuremberg to-day the case against Admiral Donetz.

It was alleged by the prosecution that Donetz was responsible for the carrying out of the U-boat building programme after the Anglo-German naval agreement of 1935.

Official documents were quoted to show that in four years Donetz had built up a great fleet of U-boats. In 1940, it was stated, U-boats sent to the bottom 3,000,000 tons of British shipping.

## MOTHER CHARGED WITH MURDER

At a special Court at Adare to-day, before Mr. C. S. Kenny, B.L., D.J., a young girl named Ellen Quaid, unmarried, with an address in Newcastle West, was again remanded for a week on a charge of murdering her two years old daughter, Mary Quaid, on 18th December last.

The application for the remand was made by Supt. McKenna, Newcastle West.

Some hundreds of animals inspected, the number condemned was very small which would go to supply live-stock, generally sound and healthy. It is mentioned that the cost of parts of carcasses is considerable for the aggregate already mentioned.
