CHINESE DEMAND TO RUSSIA

At Chungking about 4,000 Chinese students held another "Quit Manchuria" parade on Saturday. Slogans carried by the demonstrators included demands for full publicity of the Sino-Soviet discussions on Manchuria, the immediate withdrawal of the Russians, submission of the question to U.N.O., and Chinese unity "to meet the current emergency."
