**PASSING OF AN OLD GAEL**

Mr. John Crotty, who has died at an advanced age at his residence, Foxhall, Colmanswell, had been a generous benefactor to Colmanswell Church, many of the fine new church furnishings having been donated by him (writes our Bally- agran correspondent).

In his early days he took a keen interest in athletics and Gaelic games and with (Major) Larry Roche, the Leahy brothers and others, sponsored the establishment of a football team in his native parish. He was a close personal friend of Rev. E. Punch, Chairman, Limerick G.A.A. County Board, who was present at the interment at St. Colman's Cemetery, together with Rev. P. McNamara, P.P., Ballya- gran, and Rev. P. Murphy, C.C., Colmanswell. There was a very large and representative funeral attendance.
