MR. J. CLIFFORD, TOBERNEA, KILMALLOCK.

The death, following an accident, of this highly esteemed gentleman, which took place at St. John's Hospital, Limerick, on Good Friday, was received with feelings of the most intense grief by all members of the community. Aged 74, he emigrated to the U.S. in his early manhood, returning after some years to become a most successful farmer at the ancestral home. After the Rising of Easter Week he became an enthusiastic and uncompromising supporter of the Sinn Fein movement and occupied the position of President of the Effin Club, from which body he was always chosen to attend conventions and other important meetings. To all who had the privilege of his friendship, he was a tried and true confidant and could always be depended on to help in time of affliction and sorrow. The remains were brought to Effin Church, and the vast cortege which attended the funeral to the local cemetery on Saturday, April 20th, was a tribute of sorrow that the deceased well deserved.
