The untimely death of Mr. Ciaran O'Kelly, N.T., has removed from our midst an exemplary citizen, a loyal and energetic member of the Trade Union Movement, an untiring worker on behalf of the National Teachers, and an active member of Muintir na Tire and Feile Luimnighe, and Vocational Education Committee.

For thirty years he was a member of the City Trades Council, and before his death was its Chairman. Although he was always an uncompromising champion of the workers' cause, his singleness of purpose and genuine fairness won for him the confidence and esteem of the employers. In furtherance of peace in the industrial life of the city, his aim was to revive the Conciliation Board, which did so much good in former years.

His recent illnesses and the death of three children thwarted his desire to make provision for his loved ones.
