AGED WOMAN'S DEATH

Dr. J. P. Cleary, Coroner for East
Limerick, held an inquest at the
Co. Hospital, Croom, into the cir-
cumstances of the death of an aged
woman named Mrs. Hannah Fitz-
gerald, Castleroberts, Adare.

Sergt. Griffin, Adare, stated that
he found the deceased lying in the
fireplace in her kitchen on 2nd
April. She was undressed, but there
was some clothing underneath the
body. The fire was extinguished
and he had no suspicion of foul
play. He found some small sums
of money in the house.

Dr. Costello, Adare, stated that
there were no signs of violence.
Death was due to chronic heart
failure.

A verdict in accordance with the
medical testimony was returned.
