TRAGEDY IN LIMERICK BARRACKS

A shocking tragedy occurred in the Sarsfield Barracks, Limerick, yesterday evening, as the result of which a young soldier, a Limerick man, lost his life. The dead soldier is Private Martin Ryan, who lived at 28 Garvey's Range (off Broad Street). He was unmarried.

It would appear that the deceased was being detained in the guard-room, and that while the guard was being changed he sustained a fatal bullet wound.

It is stated that during the ceremony of the changing of the guard the deceased secured a rifle off the rack and took it to the wash-house. Members of the guard, who were outside, heard a shot and, rushing in, found Ryan in a pool of blood. There was a bullet wound in the abdomen and death appeared to be instantaneous.

There was one spent cartridge in the breach of the rifle.

The body was later removed to the morgue at Barrington's Hospital pending the holding of an inquest.
