MORE BUTTER.

A recent Department of Industry and Commerce report states that stocks of creamery butter rose from 92,481 cwt. to 116,041 cwt. between July 15th and July 31st last. Factory and other butter stocks increased from 7,371 to 8,790 cwt. From July 16th to July 31st last production of creamery butter was approximately 50,381 cwt., as compared with 44,482 cwt. in the corresponding period last year.

Mr. Cuinneagain, in his address, outlined the aims and objects of the party, stating that they stood for patriotism, not politics, and that their ultimate object was a 32 county Irish speaking Republic.

Referring to the language position, Mr. Cuinneagain stated that to-day after over twenty years of native Government, only two per cent. of the people spoke the native tongue, and unless the decay was arrested the language would be lost to the nation. During the war it was estimated that no fewer than 160,000 Irishmen were members of the British armed forces, and Britain was solely responsible for the partition of this country. They did not deny that Messrs. De Valera and Mulcahy had acted well on Ireland's behalf in the dim distant past, but they should judge them by their actions of to-day, which found them mixed up in a politicians' gamble, so he appealed to the people to rally round the standard of Aiseirighe, which stood for a country free and Gaelic.

DEATH OF AN ABBEYFEALE OCTOGENARIAN

The death of Mr. Patrick O'Sullivan, a highly respected farmer, of Abbeyfeale Hill, took place after a protracted illness at the age of 82. Possessed of many excellent qualities, he commanded the esteem of many friends and relatives who regret his demise. A very large funeral accompanied the remains to the Abbeyfeale Parish Church, and there was also a very large attendance at the interment in the Old Abbey Cemetery, where the prayers at the graveside were read by the Very Rev. P. Canon Carroll, P.P., V.F.
