THE MUNSTER FAIR

The Munster Fair at Limerick this morning was unusually large. Trade was not buoyant as buyers were not prepared to give the high prices that ruled at the previous fair. Vendors had to accept reduced values to the extent of 50/- per head. In the end there was a reasonably good clearance. Average prices—3 year old bullocks (forward condition), £33 10s. to £35; 2 year olds, £29 to £31, yearlings, £16 15s. to £18 5s.; 3 year old heifers, £31 to £33; 2 year olds do., £27 to £29; yearlings, £15 10s. to £17 15s.; prime beef, 65/- per cwt. on foot. Good demand for aged cattle at fixed factory price.
