GOLDEN JUBILEE

MOST REV. DR. DUHIG

The Archbishop of Brisbane, Most Rev. Dr. James Duhig, who will celebrate next Thursday the Golden Jubilee of his ordination to the priesthood, was born in Broadford, Co. Limerick, seventy-five years ago. He studied in the Irish College, Rome, and was ordained priest in 1896. In 1905 he was consecrated Bishop of Rockhampton, became Titular Archbishop of Amida and Coadjutor-Archbishop of Brisbane in 1912. Five years later he succeeded to the See of Brisbane.
