DEEPLY REGRETTED

Widespread regret has been
occasioned by the death, which
occurred unexpectedly on Saturday
night, of Mr. Michael J. O'Sullivan,
Bank Place, Hospital. The late
Mr. O'Sullivan was a prominent
figure in the town. He carried on
an extensive cattle exporting trade
over a long number of years, and
was well-known at all Munster
fairs.

Deceased was a staunch supporter
and patron of the G.A.A. and did
much to popularise hurling and
football in South Limerick. He was
himself, in his younger days, a
well-known footballer and figured
with many local teams.

He was foremost in all local
endeavours and enterprises, and,
since its formation, was a promi-
nent member of Hospital Guild,
Muintir na Tire and Parish Council.

His remains were removed to St.
John's Parish Church on Sunday
evening, accompanied by a very
large concourse of mourners,
friends and relatives. The huge
attendance at the interment in the
adjoining cemetery on Monday was
but small indication of the popu-
larity which the deceased enjoyed.
