## TRADITION OF CLARE BAR

James Prendergast, of 15 The Quay, New Ross, Wexford, was charged at Ennis District Court with dangerous driving, and when the case was called, District Justice Gleeson said a letter had been received from the State Solicitor, Co. Wexford, stating if it was necessary for the defendant to be represented by a solicitor in Ennis, he would forward the summons to enable the facts to be put before the Court, but as Mr. Prendergast was in poor circumstances, he would like, if possible, to avoid putting him to expense.

Mr. I. M. Houlihan, solr., said the view the local Bar took of a case like that was that if asked to do a case for a poor person, it was always done without any "ifs" or "ands," and would be done now.

The District Justice said that was what he expected of the Clare Bar. He would adjourn the case, and if the defendant desired to be represented by a solicitor he was quite sure some member of the local Bar would undertake the work.
