

# LIMERICK TICKET HOLDERS'

## DECISION

It is now learned that the lucky holders of the Hospitals Sweep ticket bearing the nom de plume, "Lucky July," 34 Cecil St., Limerick, are Mr. Michael Collins, licensed trader, of the same address, and his wife. The ticket drew Claro, the firm first favourite for the Cambridgeshire Stakes, which race will be run at Newmarket, headquarters of the English turf, on Wednesday next.

Mr. Collins bought the ticket on his birthday, which occurred during the month of July—hence his choice of "Lucky July."

Messrs. James McLean, Ltd., a well-known firm of Scottish turf accountants, were anxious to purchase a share of the ticket, but the holders declined to enter negotiations, and are taking the chance that their good luck will hold good on Wednesday.

It is interesting to note that Mr. James McLean is a patron of Irish racing and his horses are trained by Mr. H. M. Hartigan at the Curragh, who had charge of Claro before he joined Mr. F. Butters' string at Newmarket. The horse is considered to have an outstanding chance of giving both trainer and jockey (G. Richards) their first win in the second leg of the "autumn double."
