#### "SUICIDE PHIALS" ON BLACK MARKET

Many thousands of phials of potassium cyanide, the poison stated to have been used by Goering, Himmler and other leading Nazis, were seized by Berlin police officials when they arrested 34-year-old Gunther Wulff and his black market agent for the sale of the phials, each of which contained a fatal dose. Wulff is stated to have been selling the phials since 1945 at 1/7½ each.
