## "SUICIDE PHIALS" ON BLACK MARKET

Many thousands of phials of  
potassium cyanide, the poison  
stated to have been used by Goer-  
ing, Himmler and other leading  
Nazis, were seized by Berlin police  
officials when they arrested 34-  
year-old Gunther Wulff and his  
black market agent for the sale of  
the phials, each of which contained  
a fatal dose. Wulff is stated to  
have been selling the phials since  
1945 at 1/7½ each.

## ABUNDANCE OF HERRINGS

Nearly 10,000,000 herrings were
