DEATH OF MR. JAMES HASSETT

The death of Mr. James Hassett, Thomondgate, Limerick, which occurred on the 8th inst., has removed a figure who was prominently identified with the public life of Limerick for many years.

A member of an old Co. Limerick family, he came into the city as a young man, and in a comparatively short time, by his energy and ability, singled himself out as a citizen of merit. He was elected a member of the first Labour Corporation under John Daly, the Fenian leader and patriot, on which body he continued to represent the Castle Ward for many years subsequently. He was also a member of the old Limerick Board of Guardians. In private life the late Mr. Hassett was held in very high regard and esteem by hosts of friends, all of whom sincerely regret the passing of this fine old figure. Very deep sympathy is tendered to the family in their bereavement.

The funeral on Monday last from St. Munchin's Church to Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery was representative of the city and adjoining counties.

We had the use of illustrated papers, etc., supplied by general of the hospital. Extra key and bacon, was provided for Christmas.
