CO. LIMERICK NEWS PASSES AWAY IN SWINFORD The death took place during the week of Sister Mary Lelia (McEniry) at the Convent of Mercy, Swinford, Co. Mayo. The late Sister M. Lelia, who had reached an advanced age, was sister of the late Mr. John McEniry, Hill House, Bruff, and of Sister Mary Joseph (McEniry), Buffalo, New York. She was also aunt of Misses Annie and Lelia McEniry, Main Street, Hospital, and of Mrs. R. J. Donworth, and Mr. John McEniry, Bruff. The late Sister M. Lelia had been for 37 years an esteemed member of the Convent of Mercy Community, having taken her first religious vows in 1909.
