## DEATH OF MR. A. J. EAKINS

With very sincere regret we chronicle the death of Mr. A. J. Eakins, a highly esteemed and respected citizen, who passed away on Monday last after a long illness.

The late Mr. Eakins, who was Managing-Director of Messrs. George McKern & Sons, took an active interest in cultural pursuits and frequently lectured on subjects of historical interest. In pre-Treaty days he was a Justice of the Peace and though he did not identify himself with the national movement in any of its phases he was held in high regard by all sections of the community. A very charitable man, he did a good deal unostentatiously to relieve distress, and in that connection it was his custom to pay visits periodically to families, irrespective of religious persuasion, who stood in need of succour and assistance.

The interment took place on Christmas Day in the grounds of St. Munchin's Protestant Church.
