## Priest's Tragic Death

## Sequel To Accident In England

## County Limerick Family's Sad Bereavement.

Forty-seven priests were present at St Mary's Church, Lulworth Castle, Dorestshire, at the Solemn Requiem Mass for Rev. Father Patrick Dwane, PP, of Lulworth

Castle, who was drowned when the 10 h p saloon oar in which he was travelling plunged over the end of a bridge and fell ten or twelve feet into the flooded River

Frome at Holme Bridge, Dorset ...

Father Dwane, who was 48, was from Kilfinane, co Limerick. He was brother of Rev Fr Jarlath, orm, of the Franciscan Friary, Clevedon, Somerset; of Sister Patrick, the Presentation Convent, Durrow, Laoghis, and of Mr J J Dwane, Hospital, co Limerick.

He had been to the Holy Ghost Church, Dorset, and must have reached Holme Bridge before 8 p m on his journey back to

Lulworth Castle.

A man passing by at 8 p m saw what he thought was a light in the water but paid

little attention to it

Passing back about 11 pm the same man noticed ligh's again and this time glooked over the temporary wooden parapet—the bidge parapets have been extensively damaged in recent years by beavy military

He found that the parapets had been broken down and that the lights were coming from a car partially subme ged in

the water.

The police were notified and an officer waded into the fast running Anod swoollen river to find the car lying at an angle, the offside completely submerged and the near side submerged to above the seats.

The front near side door was open but there was no trace of any occupante, although an attache case was found in the

It is believed that when the car plunged over the end of the bridge Father Dwane, in trying to escape, was swept away by the swiftly running torrent,
